

Samples of CPV Project Descriptions

Flyaway Productions will support the arts-based urban redevelopment strategies of community partner, Urban Solutions, focusing on San Francisco's Central Market/6th Street neighborhood, resulting in Flyaway's 2012 production of *Niagara Falling*. Funds will cover choreographer and dancers' fees, film production, and set/rigging materials.

Khmer Arts Academy will bring four artists from Cambodia for a one-week residency in Long Beach's Cambodia Town, where they will work with local artists and students and opening their work to the community. At the conclusion, the visiting artists will give a public concert with our local dance students at the Long Beach Museum of Art. This concert will include a performance of a sacred dance drama, a dance ritual, a book launch and a celebration of the tenth anniversary of the founding of the organization. Estimated attendance will be 900.

Oakland Asian Cultural Center will support outreach and development of arts-focused after school youth programs, at their site, in partnership with three Alameda-based youth organizations: Ger Youth Center, the Asian branch of the Oakland Public Library, and API Youth Promoting Advocacy & Leadership. Programs will serve over 250 Mongolian, Chinese, Vietnamese, Filipino, and South Asian youth ages 6-18.

San Benito County Arts Council will create a formal partnership with the Blak Sage Gallery to provide greater access to the arts through new and expanded programs for individuals, youth, families, and the artist community; and will also partner with the Hollister Downtown Association and other business cooperatives to promote economic growth in the downtown area and community development in the arts.

La Raza Galería Posada will partner with the Midtown Business Association (MBA) to expand its *Día de los Muertos* programming and promote economic activity with the creation of altars by local artists that will be installed in MBA businesses.
